RE: New Tanker for Wellesley Station

Background / History:

Included in the 2012 Fire Capital Budget will be a request to replace the existing Wellesley Tanker which was built in 1993. This tanker is now nineteen years old and by replacing it at this time we anticipate both increased operational efficiency, reduced maintenance costs as well as a much needed update to our current tanker technologies.

Financial Implications / Impacts:

The Fire Chief will provide Council a report outlining the results of the RFP which will assist Council in choosing a vendor. Budget estimated cost \$275,000.00 to be funded from the 2012 Fire Equipment Reserve. Replacement at this time satisfies the fleet replacement program by maintaining a consistent reserve contribution and therefore helping to stabilize the tax rate.

Staff Comments / Summary: The Fire Chief is requesting consent from Council to prepare a specification for a new tanker, and request proposals from qualified vendors. This request is being made to allow the Township of Wellesley to benefit from the option to look at stock trucks, and possible in production, or demonstrator units, and compare the proposals to the Department specifications. Currently the Canadian dollar is of high value which could also result in significant savings to the municipality. By initiating this process prior to budget approval we can clearly establish the true cost of the new tanker. The new tanker will be built to meet current safety standards and assist the Fire Department in maintaining the Certified Tanker Shuttle Certification. It is anticipated that delivery of the new tanker will not occur until mid or late 2012.

Recommendations:

That the Council of the Township of Wellesley support this request and grant approval to the Fire Chief to prepare a specification for a new fire tanker (for the Wellesley Station) and obtain quotations and proposals from qualified vendors subject to budget and Council approval.
